Inglewood Man Convicted of Halloween Shooting on USC Campus

An Inglewood man has been convicted of attempted murder after opening fire at a 2012 Halloween party on the USC campus, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office announced.

Brandon Spencer, 21, was convicted Monday of four counts of attempted murder. Jurors also found true weapons and gang allegations.

Prosecutors said Spencer shot and wounded four people, including former Crenshaw High School football star Geno Hall, outside a party sponsored by the Black Student Assembly on Oct. 31, 2012.

Deputy District Attorney Antonella Nistorescu said the shooting was a result of an ongoing feud on social media between Spencer and Hall, a member of the Rollin' 40 Crips.

Neither Spencer nor any of the four victims attended USC at the time of the shooting.

Spencer is scheduled to be sentenced Feb. 21. He faces up to life in prison.

The case was investigated by USC Department of Public Safety and the Los Angeles Police Department.
