## Three Charged in Baby Kidnapping-Murder Plot

Prosecutors today charged a Thousand Oaks woman and an Oceanside man with the January kidnapping and murder of an infant girl and the attempted murder of the baby's three adult family members, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office announced.

The pair and a third defendant also are charged with the attempted murder of a 23-year-old woman and the attempted kidnapping of her 4-month-old baby boy in an El Segundo motel on Feb. 6.

Giseleangelique Rene D'Milian (dob 3/30/67), Anthony Ray McCall (dob 12/4/85) and Todd Damon Boudreaux (dob 12/10/71) are scheduled to be arraigned today after 1:30 p.m. at the Los Angeles County Superior Court in Long Beach, Department So1, in case NA101490. Prosecutors will ask that bail be set at \$5 million each for D'Milian and McCall and \$1 million for Boudreaux.

Deputy District Attorney Cynthia Barnes with the Major Crimes Division is prosecuting the case.

D'Milian and McCall are charged with the kidnapping and murder of 3-week-old Eliza De La Cruz, who was taken from her Long Beach home on Jan. 3. Her body was discovered the next day in a trash bin in San Diego County. They also are charged with the attempted murders of the infant's mother, father and uncle.

D'Milian is suspected of orchestrating the kidnapping-murder plot to secure two babies after allegedly telling her boyfriend she was pregnant with twins even though she was not.

If convicted as charged, the three face up to life in state prison.

The case remains under investigation by the Long Beach Police Department and the El Segundo Police Department.
