Man Sentenced to Prison for Teen's Overdose Death

A 19-year-old man was sentenced today to 12 years in state prison for furnishing drugs to a teenage girl, resulting in her death, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office announced.

On April 26, a jury found Treyvon Love Ollo (dob 8/14/98) guilty of one felony count of furnishing a controlled substance to a minor in case KA115677. Jurors also found true a special allegation that the defendant committed great bodily injury to the victim during the commission of the crime.

Deputy District Attorney Michelle Graves of the Victim Impact Program prosecuted the case.

On the morning of June 30, 2017, Ollo invited his 16-year-old girlfriend to his Covina home, the prosecutor said.

The girl arrived at the residence and the defendant offered her drugs, according to the prosecutor. The teen then snorted what she believed was cocaine and began to overdose, the prosecutor added.

Paramedics were called and girl was pronounced dead at the scene.

According to trial testimony, although the teenager believed she was snorting cocaine, the drug was fentanyl and the victim died from fentanyl intoxication.

The case was investigated by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.
