“White Pages Bandit” Sentenced to 12 Years in Prison for Series of San Fernando Burglaries

A man known as the “White Pages Bandit” entered guilty pleas today for a string of San Fernando Valley burglaries, the Los Angeles County District Attorney’s Office announced.

Deputy District Attorney Kathy Ta said Aramis Davae Williams (dob 11/28/83) pleaded guilty to seven counts of first-degree residential burglary, and admitted the special allegation that a person was present at some of those burglaries.

Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge David Gelfound of the San Fernando Branch sentenced Williams to 12 years in state prison. A restitution hearing is scheduled for June 20 in Department D for case PA079234.

The defendant burglarized 18 homes between July 18, 2013 and Nov. 22, 2013, Deputy District Attorney Ta said. Williams used several reverse directory apps on his electronic device to find out the telephone numbers of the victims and would then call to see if anyone was home before entering the houses, the prosecutor added.

Williams stole several thousand dollars worth of cash and jewelry, stealing as much as \$100,000 worth of property in one burglary, the prosecutor said. Based on several missed calls received by the victims, police used phone records to determine that the calls came from the defendant while he was in the vicinity of the homes, Ta added.

The case was investigated by the Los Angeles Police Department, Foothill Division.
