**Convicted Sex Offender Charged
With Rape While Out on Bail**

A convicted sex offender was charged today with raping a woman in Torrance while he was out on bail on another case, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office.

Guy Allen Dietz (dob 1/13/71) of Calabasas faces one count each of forcible rape, forcible oral copulation and sexual penetration by foreign object in case YA091064.

Arraignment is scheduled for tomorrow morning in Department 4 of the Los Angeles County Superior Court, Torrance Branch.

On Aug. 28, Dietz arranged to have the victim come to a home in Torrance. When she arrived, he presented a badge and handcuffs and claimed to be an undercover police officer before forcing her to orally copulate him, engage in acts of digital penetration and sexual intercourse, the prosecutor said.

When the victim tried to escape, Dietz allegedly struck her. When she did manage to escape, the victim called police and the defendant fled the scene. The following day he led police in a high-speed pursuit before being apprehended in Monterey County, the prosecutor added.

Dietz had been out on bail in case LA077201 for failing to register as a sex offender. The felony complaint alleges a 1998 rape conviction and two drug-related convictions in 2005 and 2010.

Deputy District Attorney Frank Dunnick is requesting bail in the amount of \$3 million.

The case is under investigation by the Torrance Police Department.
