Felix Fey is a Los Angeles-area student advocate and civic leader. He serves as a Student Commissioner on the City of Glendale's Sustainability Commission where he helps his city meet and exceed its sustainability goals. He is the Founder of the Book Rescue Project, a community initiative that collects used books, keeping them from landfills and redistributing them to underserved communities and literacy-focused programs, including L.A. County's Books for Jails. He was also President of the Glendale Central Library Teen Advisory Board, having helped design and create new Youth Spaces enjoyed by over 54,000 kids and teens.

Believing young people should have a voice in their communities, he was appointed Chair of the Student Advisory Board for nationwide nonprofit Students for Civic Impact. A senior at Flintridge Preparatory School, Felix is Student Body Vice President and captains both the Mock Trial and Speech & Debate teams. As Lead Prosecutor, he has competed at the highest levels of L.A. County Mock Trial. In Speech & Debate, he competes in Congressional Debate and Extemporaneous Commentary.

He is Founder and President of the Legal Advocacy Club where students learn about wrongful incarceration cases and advocate for change because fighting for stronger crime victim support should never mean putting innocent people in prison.
