Skylar Myers is currently the Victims Rights Advocate for the Anti-Violence Project at the Los Angeles LGBT Center and has been working for the empowerment of marginalized and often victimized communities for more than a decade. Myers work with the LGBTQIA+ community has also included serving as a homeless youth advisor and mentor in both supervisory and advocacy roles.

In their current position as Victims' Rights Advocate, Myers provides trauma-informed, client-centered, and affirming holistic legal support services to LGBTQI+ survivors of hate violence and discrimination. Myers also facilitates Know Your Rights community workshops on hate violence and discrimination. Additionally, they are developing a hate violence prevention model, purposefully focused on protecting those most at risk within LGBTQI+ communities, Transgender women of color. Based upon the experience of our clients, Myers also works to proactively advance institutional change within the court system, law enforcement, and with service providers.

Myers also serves on the Board of the non-profit Project Q, an organization that nourishes the development of LGBTQIA+ youth and its surrounding community through self-empowering workshops, gender affirming activities, and food/hygiene drives and deliveries.
