In-Person and Remote Access Options

Please be advised that a hearing pursuant to WIC 6609.1 for Harold Wachter is scheduled at 1:30 p.m. on Sept. 10, 2026, in Department 113 at the Hollywood Courthouse, located at 5925 Hollywood Blvd., Los Angeles, with Judge Robert Harrison presiding.

The Court will provide both in-person and remote observation options for this hearing for members of the public. Per Welfare and Institutions Code Section 6609.1(b), no public comment will be taken at the hearing. Individuals interested in observing the proceeding should review the information below.

Instructions for Obtaining a Seat in the Courtroom at the Hollywood Courthouse

Seating capacity in Department 113 at the Hollywood Courthouse is limited. To accommodate in-person public observation, five seats in the courtroom will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. We'll seat those individuals promptly at 1:30 p.m.

Remote Observation Option

Any member of the public may observe the proceeding remotely via [LACourtConnect](#) (LACC) using case number ZM016752. Those wishing to view remotely are encouraged to log in between 1:15 and 1:30 p.m., and no later than 1:30 p.m.

Photography, Video, Audio & Electronic Devices

Recording, photographing, or broadcasting this proceeding is strictly prohibited pursuant to [Superior Court of Los Angeles County Local Rule 2.17](#) and [California Rule of Court 1.150](#). This restriction applies uniformly to Department 113 at the Hollywood Courthouse and to those observing the proceedings remotely via LACC.

Cellphone and laptop use in Department 113 at the Hollywood Courthouse is not allowed at any time.

Expressive Activity

Members of the public are also instructed to follow the Court's General Order 2023-GEN-005-00 on Expressive Activity, [linked here](#), which restricts Demonstrations, Distributions, Solicitation, and Other Expressive Activity both inside courthouses and near courthouse entrances.
